

Alternative Placement Options

Alternative Option	Requirements	Procedure
College courses from other college/ university	Must be a college Math or English class with grade of 2.0 or higher.	Submit unofficial (or official) transcript to Pirate Central by fax or in person for placement evaluation.
Placement test from other college	Test scores must be within the last 2 years. Will accept Compass or Accuplacer scores. Check with Testing Center if asking about another placement exam.	Scores need to be sent to the Testing Center directly from other college by fax, email or in sealed envelope.
High School Transcript English placement (may be used for Running Start)	Students currently enrolled in Sequim or Port Angeles high schools or who graduated within the last 2 years may be placed into English based on the HS transcript placement chart on reverse. This is currently only available to Sequim and Port Angeles students.	Submit official or unofficial high school transcript to Pirate Central with a High School Placement Request Form for review.
Smarter Balanced (SB) test scores (may be used for Running Start)	Students currently enrolled in a Washington state high school or who graduated within the last 2 years may be placed based on the Smarter Balanced HS Assessment chart on reverse. Must receive a score of 3 or 4 to be placed into a Math or English course.	Submit copy of SB scores from the Smarter Balanced website or High School counselor signature with a High School Placement Request Form for review.
Bridge to College High School class (may be used for Running Start)	Students may be placed into English and Math if they have completed a Bridge to College high school class with a B or better grade (English #01069, Math #02099).	Submit high school transcript with Bridge class with a High School Placement Request form for review.
Advanced Placement (AP) Exams (may be used for Running Start)	Students may be placed into, or receive credit for, Math and English course based on qualifying scores on the AP exams. Link to AP Placement Guide: http://pencol.edu/sites/default/files/PeninsulaCollege-AP-Guide.pdf	Submit official AP exam scores from the College Entrance Exam Board.
WA State Placement Reciprocity	Students who have been placed into Math or English courses at a WA state community or technical college may request reciprocity placement. Placement must have been made within the last 2 years.	Contact Testing Center to determine appropriate documentation required and submit with the

High School Transcript Placement
