Program Features:

- Students **MUST** be 21 to receive their diploma. However, students may begin working toward their diploma before turning 21.
- Cost: \$25/quarter (financial aid is available).
- Credits earned in high school count toward required graduation credits.
- A personalized academic plan ensures student will take the necessary courses and move through the program efficiently.
- Work or life experience can be used toward high school credit.
- A flexible schedule, with many courses offered online, is designed to allow students to determine how quickly they will complete the course.
- Depending on how many credits were earned in high school, students can receive their degree in as little as 10 weeks.
- The Peninsula College high school diploma is equivalent to one offered by any high school. Our HS21+ curriculum is designed to prepare students for immediate success in college or a career; statistics show that high school diplomas are more widely accepted by employers than GEDs.
