

Running Start—

Alternative Placement Options

Appropriate placement is important as it affects a student's ability to progress through their

courses and promotes academic success in their program of study. In order to determine the best classes for you, your reading, writing, and math skills will be assessed.

To Participate in Running Start

Students must place into college-level English and/or math by qualifying through an approved alternative placement option or by taking the placement exam. *College-level math is not required* for admission to the program however, students who plan to enroll in math or science courses through Running Start must have the appropriate placement.

ACCUPLACER

The ACCUPLACER placement assessment is a computer-based, untimed assessment and is one way students can qualify for the Running Start program. The cost is \$20 to take the test. Check the website frequently for available testing dates.

NEW Take the Placement Exam Virtually


You may take your ACCUPLACER placement test in the privacy of your home using a remote proctoring service. You need a computer, a web cam and a high-speed Internet connection. There is an additional \$25 fee for this. Complete the online form to begin the process.

Not Everyone Needs to Test

Alternative placement options are available to qualify for the Running Start Program and should be your first choice. Taking the placement exam can be the final option to qualify for college-level English and/or math courses.

ACCUPLACER Assessment

Submit all alternative placement paperwork with an <u>Alternative Placement Request Form</u> to the Assessment and Placement Center in the Student Services Building (D) for placement review.

High School English Agreement

Students from **Port Angeles or Sequim high schools** may be eligible to use high school transcripts as the English qualification for Running Start based on the *HS placement chart below*. Students must have a cumulative high school GPA of 2.5 or higher. We will accept completion of at least 1 semester and will use the most recent semester grade. Submit official or unofficial high school transcript. **This is currently only available to Sequim and Port Angeles High School students.**

Advanced Placement

Advancement Placement is a program available in high schools to provide students the opportunity to take college level courses in the high school setting. Students who have completed AP classes **and** the AP exams may be eligible for placement at Peninsula College. Students may be placed into, or receive credit for, math and English courses based on qualifying scores on the AP exams. To utilize test scores for placement, please submit your official AP exam score report from the College Board.
