WHAT IS RUNNING START?

It is a statewide Dual credit program for juniors and seniors enrolled in a public high school

Running Start is a way to complete your high school graduation requirements while earning college credit, and maybe even earn a degree!

Tuition free classes at the college up to a full-time schedule

CONSIDERATIONS

- Readiness to be a college student
- Involvement in sports, drama, and other HS activities
- Classes cover more material in depth at a faster pace –less time in class and more homework
- The college breaks do not always align with your high school break
- Grade impact Grades are recorded on your HS and college transcript and become a part of your permanent record at PC. Low grades or failure to complete courses may jeopardize high school graduation, admission to another college or other future education plans

WHAT CLASSES CAN YOU TAKE?

Any college level class that you meet the prerequisite for (on campus, online, hybrid).

RUNNG START AT PC

You will be assigned a PC Advisor based on which high school you attend They will keep track of your remaining high school graduation requirements by following your Planning Form (Equivalency Guide)

Build a 2-year academic plan covering all high school classes needed and the courses to complete an Associate's degree

Save one required HS class for senior year

Try to finish all HS required classes by winter quarter your senior year

Listen to the advice of your high school counselor and assigned PC Advisor

RUNNING START IS NOT FREE

CREDITS AND EQUIVALENCY

- For each five-credit class at Peninsula, a student earns a full year of high school credit. For example, a student who takes English 101 during fall quarter at Peninsula will earn credit for either English 11 or English 12 at the high school.
- A full-time RS student will take 15 credits (3 classes) per quarter and earn up to 9 HS credits per year.
- Tuition free college credit is based on the funding limit table on the RSEVF (basically more classes at the high school means less tuition free courses at the college)

RUNNING START IS NOT FREE



Tuition is waived up to 15 college-level credits per quarter (for fall, winter & spring quarters).

Students are responsible for the cost of:

Course & Student Fees (Technology, Lab, Student Life, Graduation, Transportation & Class supplies

> Tuition for under 100-level courses and credits over the allowed funding limits

> > All other costs (books, supplies, transportation, etc.)

FEE WAIVER / BOOK ASSISTANCE

RUNNIG START AT PC

Fee Waiver (free & reduced lunch students):

Income eligibility is confirmed via the RSEVF (for students who have qualified at any time during the past five years for the *free/reduced* lunch program) This waiver covers class fees (excluding consumable fees), and tuition for excess credits.

Running Start Textbook Assistance (for students who qualify for free lunch only):

Free lunch eligibility documentation from the school district is required annually. Students are loaned books from the RS Book Library & also receive up to \$175.00 per quarter to purchase books in the campus bookstore.

Note: All PAHS, QVSD, & CFSD, students qualify for fee waivers & book assistance through the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP). However, they must request assistance by filling out a RS Book Assistance and Fee Waiver Application.



RUNNING START AT PC

HOW TO QUALIFY FOR RUNNING START

- Enrollment at a public high school or school district
- Junior or Senior status (determined by the high school)
- Eligible for college level English (ENGL 101) or college level math (Math 107 or above)



PLACEMENT OPTIONS

- High School Transcript
- College High School Transcript
- College Placement Test, ACCUPLACER No Fee
- High School Smarter Balanced Assessment Scores
- ACT/SAT scores
- AP English Scores
- Placement results from another Washington state community college

GETTING STARTED- RS CHECKLIST



Plan early! -Registration for the fall quarter starts on June 5

- Complete an <u>ONLINE</u> PC application at <u>www.pencol.edu</u> Click on Enroll/ Online Application-Apply Now! Note: Be sure to select "Running Start" as your student type
- Qualify for college level English OR math (through alternative placement or by taking the placement test) and activate your ctcLink Student Account
- <u>Once qualified</u> fill out the RSEVF & Planning Form with your high school Counselor
- Review the RS Handbook and read/sign the PC Running Start Agreement Form
- ✓ Advise & Register
- Running Start Orientation- Dates will be announced soon for in-person summer orientation. An online option is available for student who attend the Forks or Port Townsend site or are distance online students.
- ✓ Pay your fees and purchase your textbooks

TIMELINE

March/April

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- February/March
 - Apply to the college
 - Qualify through alternative placement/or placement test

RUNNG START AT PC

- Once qualified Fill out the RSEVF & Planning Form with your high school counselor. Also complete the RS Agreement and optional Release of Information Form.
- June 5 New Running Start Advising begins
- Summer/ TBD Attend in person Orientation
