This rule requires institutions of higher education to adopt student disciplinary procedures addressing sex discrimination, including sex-based harassment. And emergency updated was filed to be compliant with federal regulations. WAC132A-126 was repealed in its entirety and new WAC 132A-127 was submitted. These new definitions of prohibited behavior and updated procedures are necessary to address conduct that may pose a threat to the general welfare of the college community and/or college operations and to protect the constitutional and procedural rights of individual students
