



Webster Scholarship

History

Funding for the Webster Scholarship comes from an endowment established by the late Charles N. Webster, whose family founded the KONP radio station and the newspaper that is now known as the *Peninsula Daily News*.

Quarterly Award Amount

Full - Time (12+ credits):	\$1500
$\frac{3}{4}$ - Time (9-11 credits):	\$1200
$\frac{1}{2}$ - Time (6-8 credits):	\$900
Less than $\frac{1}{2}$ - Time (5 credits only):	\$700

Each award is determined by the student's enrollment level, as indicated above. The courses students must take are identified below. If the required course(s) for any quarter add up to less than 5 credits, students must register for additional credits to bring their quarterly credit total up to a 5 credit minimum. If the scholarship isn't used one quarter, the student will lose it for the rest of the year – with the exception of absence due to military service.

Grade point average requirement

Students must maintain a 2.00 cumulative grade point average at Peninsula College. In addition, Communication Studies - Journalism path students must maintain a 3.00 combined grade point average in their Communication Studies - Journalism classes, and Multimedia Communication degree students must maintain a 3.00 combined grade point average in their Multimedia Communication classes.

Enrollment requirement

Students must enroll in the following classes:

Communication Studies - Journalism students:

Must have declared Communication Studies - Journalism as their education track and enroll in either a minimum of 5 credits of Communication Studies – Journalism (CMST) classes **or** Directed Studies 290-294 approved by Communication Studies – Journalism faculty.

Multimedia Communication students:

Must have declared Multimedia Communication as their education track (coded 524N or 524T or 524U) and enroll in either a minimum of 5 credits from the Media Communication graduation checklist each quarter **or** Directed Studies 290-294 approved by Multimedia Communication faculty.

Failure to maintain all of the requirements may result in the loss of scholarship funds.
