



MARINE RESOURCES COMMITTEE OF CLALLAM COUNTY


The Marine Resources Committee (MRC) will deliver a presentation that emphasizes marine science, ecosystem restoration, and community support.

Sergeant Marlies Dick of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) will present on prevention of human trafficking.




