AFFILIATION AND CERTIFICATION

In order to become a Washington State Certified EMT, students must be at least 18 years of age, have successfully complete an EMT course, have passed the NREMT computer-based exam and provide a document of affiliation with a pre-hospital care provider agency such as a fire department, police department, ambulance service, etc. The course instructor will explain these requirements during the class orientation on the first night. Applicants who are not affiliated may be excepted into the class based on space availability; however, affiliation must be obtained within one year after completion in order to be certified by the State of Washington. You have 12 months following completion of the class to apply for State certification.

You are also required to clear an in-depth Department of Health background check in order to receive a certificate from the State of Washington.
