**WORKER RETRAINING** 


Seeing a student get an education and move on to meaningful employment is one of the greatest perks of the job.

Anyone who's been through our Worker Retraining Program is familiar with Director Brian Kneidl. Now, thanks to a newly expanded title, he will be spending even more time in the community meeting employers and making sure college programs are matching up with local business needs.

As the Director of Workforce Services and Partnerships, Kneidl is increasing the amount of outreach he does with area employers, making sure PC's graduates are equipped with the skills employers need in their businesses today. Two of the

areas he is working more closely with are the college's Construction Technology (formerly Green Building) and Advanced Manufacturing programs.

He is always on the lookout for new places where students can train or become employed and works with dual credit students, working on articulation agreements with local high schools. In addition, he maintains his role with Worker Retraining taking students from unemployment to employment.






## LOOKING FOR A WAY TO PAY FOR COLLEGE?

Clallam Promise Scholarships can help!

Clallam Promise Scholarships are available for qualified students attending Peninsula College in 2018-19. These need-based scholarships are available to full-time students who have graduated from a Clallam County high school within the past year. Up to \$1,000 per quarter for tuition and fees, and up to \$300 for textbooks is available. Up to \$500 is available for tools and supplies. Funds are provided on a first-come, first-served basis to students with identified unmet need.

Students must complete the FAFSA and financial aid file with Peninsula College to get started.

The Clallam Promise Scholarship at Peninsula College is funded primarily by the Albert Haller Foundation, with support from the Joyce Community Scholarship and Education Foundation and the Ben & Myrtle Walkling Memorial Trust.

## FUNDING YOUR EDUCATION

To assist you in paying for your education, Peninsula College offers several options for students who qualify. Due to deadlines and limited funds, students are encouraged to apply early. Some programs are designed to support students in specific situations. Eligibility for these programs are usually determined on a funds-available basis and require a separate application to access funds.

#### FINANCIAL AID | (360) 417-6390

Applying for financial aid is a process that should be started as soon as possible. Work on your Financial Aid file at the same time you are completing other college application requirements.

#### OPPORTUNITY GRANT | (360) 417-5694

Assists low-income Washington state residents who have not yet earned a degree (Associate or higher). The grant can provide funding for tuition/fees and books/supplies for eligible adults for up to 45 credits in specific programs.

#### SCHOLARSHIPS | (360) 417-6390

Students who are attending or will be attending Peninsula College can apply now for any number of scholarships.

#### **TUITION PAYMENT PLAN** | (360) 417-6232

You can apply to have your tuition and fees divided into three payments.

#### VETERANS SERVICES | (360) 417-6224

Peninsula College recognizes and appreciates all who have served in the United States. If you are a veteran, or a survivor, or a dependent of a veteran working toward a degree or certificate, you may be eligible for veterans educational benefits.

#### WORK-STUDY | (360) 417-6359

Offers students the opportunity to gain valuable work experience while earning money for college. Both on-campus and off-campus positions are usually available.

#### BFET | (360) 417-6296

The Washington state Basic Food Employment and Training (BFET) program provides job search, job search training, educational services, skills training, and other employment opportunities to Basic Food (SNAP) recipients who are not participating in the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) WorkFirst work program.

#### WORKFIRST PROGRAM | (360) 417-6296

A referral-based program to assist parents receiving Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) that want to further their education. Parents participate in Basic Education for Adults, High School Completion, and Professional-Technical degrees at Peninsula College.

#### WORKER RETRAINING | (360) 417-6263

This free tuition program provides retraining opportunities for laid off, unemployed, and dislocated workers in the state of Washington. The financial support provided to eligible students does NOT have to be repaid.

#### COMMUNITY RESOURCES | (360) 417-6340

Peninsula College is in partnership with many organizations which provide resources, both career-oriented and financial, for students and the community.

#### STUDENT LOANS | (360) 417-6390

Loans are funded through the federal government and are accessible to students who have filed the FAFSA.

# Health Care Program Expands in Response to Critical Need for Medical Workers

There is a critical community need for registered nurses, medical assistants and certified nursing assistants on the North Olympic Peninsula. We're joining forces with healthcare providers in Clallam and Jefferson counties to grow our healthcare programs to address those needs.

Funding from a proviso in the state budget will increase capacity of current college programs as follows:

Increase medical assisting cohort from

20-40

Increase nursing assistant cohort from

40-60

Increase registered nursing cohort from

24-32

The effort will also allow more support for program enrollment, help students offset the cost of tuition and fees, increase clinical opportunities for learners, and offer enhanced career advising and job placement services for students. It will also allow local medical assisting and nursing students to be able to train and work in their communities.

Students' on-the-job training will be provided locally by Olympic Medical Center, Jefferson Healthcare, The Jamestown S'Klallam Tribe, and Forks Community Hospital, along with area convalescent, assisted living, and mental health providers.



Nursing assistants (NAC) are in high demand on the Olympic Peninsula. Because they spend more time at the bedside then other health professionals, NACs are the "eyes and ears" of a healthcare team. Learn to help vulnerable patients with activities of daily living, work with patients to prevent complications of immobility, and communicate with multiple entities to promote quality patient care.

NACs are employed in many settings including skilled nursing homes, assisted living centers, home health and hospice, and hospitals. Our program utilizes our state-of-the-art nursing lab that is equipped with modern hospital beds, simulation manikins, and spacious rooms to practice your skills with the supervision of your instructor.

Build Family and Community Relationships and Promote Learning

When you enroll in our Early Childhood Education (ECE) Program you'll discover coursework that combines theory and practical experience for working with young children and their families. Our ECE courses are based on Washington State Skill Standards for the Early Childhood and School-Age Care Professions.

Enroll in the program any quarter on a full time or part time basis. Courses are offered on the Port Angeles campus during late afternoons and evenings to accommodate working families. Classes are also offered in Port Townsend, Forks, and Neah Bay through Interactive Television (ITV). Most courses have an online component and several are offered entirely online. All Early Childhood Education courses and selected EDUC courses are STARS approved for continuing education.
