Students Get Real World View of Programming Profession in Team-Taught Course

For faculty member Eric Waterkotte there's no greater joy in teaching than seeing students transform right before his eyes.

"They tackle things they thought they weren't smart enough to do and realize that anything is possible with curiosity, patience and persistence," he said.

He will have a chance to witness that transformation when he offers CS& 141 – Programming 1 with Java spring quarter, a course he is team-teaching with professional software developer Steve Bearman.

Bearman, a Clallam County resident, approached Waterkotte with an interest in improving the local economy and people's lives by helping them see the power and portability of knowledge in worker roles such as software development.

"He has helped people in the community learn about the thriving tech force that is hiding in plain site on the peninsula," Waterkotte said. "We have some amazing, talented folks working remotely, and often in isolation, here."

Waterkotte said he hopes students gain more than they would from a typical computer science or programming course because both instructors have worked professionally as software developers for companies of various sizes, in different parts of the world. This, he said, enables them to share what the job is really like, discuss skills students typically don't learn about in school, and discover the techniques he and Bearman only learned by working in the field. In short, Waterkotte says they want students to be prepared to not just write code but to do it professionally and be successful.

"Steve and I bring different strengths from our professional backgrounds and I think students will benefit from different perspectives and stories from the real world," he said.

Outside of the classroom, Waterkotte works as the program coordinator for PC's Cybersecurity and Computer Forensics program, as well as the Information Technology Systems Administration program. He also serves as an instructional design resource for faculty and enjoys helping teach faculty how to leverage instructional tools to help students succeed by providing 21st century learning environments for them.

He holds a BSBA from Northern Arizona University in Computer Information Systems, and an MS in Information Management from University of Washington. Access to the outdoors and a desire to find an affordable, less crowded place with access to the ocean led his family to the Olympic Peninsula.

"What I have learned from my students over the years, and am constantly reminded of, is how lucky I was to have had the opportunities that I had as a child and young adult," Waterkotte said. "Something our students always reinforce for me is that it is never too late to learn new skills."

Aline Becker-Carneiro

When she arrived in Port Angeles from Curitiba, Parana, Brazil, Aline Becker-Carneiro hoped to strengthen her English skills at Peninsula College and see what interested her academically. She had a bachelor's degree in Tourism in her native country, but wasn't sure she wanted to stick with the field.

Last spring, after some exploration, Aline decided to focus on getting her associate's degree in Information Technology, and once done, will transfer to Western Washington University for her bachelor's degree.

Along the way, she also became interested in pursuing an associate's degree in Criminal Justice, saying the program is attractive from a computer forensics, cyber security angle. She enjoys challenges and working with people, but was surprised how much she liked the field, after her advisor suggested taking a single class in the program.

Not surprisingly, this member of the PC Tech Club and Phi Theta Kappa names cybersecurity instructor Eric Waterkotte as a favorite because his unique teaching approach.

"He is hands-on, he listens to student's suggestions, and he's up to date on things," she said. "He is something else. He props you up and gives you confidence."

Aline took part in the annual Collegiate Cyber Defense Competition or PRCCDC last spring. The competition gives

students a taste of defending information security assets as a real world IT professional would. She said it was a great way to improve her skills and see how the real world works.

While completing her associate degree in Cybersecurity and Computer Forensics she has worked in several capacities at PC. She started out in the music department, followed by Human Resources, then volunteered in the Information Technology (IT) department. Later, she was hired part time as an Information Technology Specialist in the College IT department, where she did her internship. She plans to continue working while pursuing her college education.

Off campus, she enjoys anything to do with the outside and horses, including competitions and trail rides, and used to live on a farm where she was able to do that. She also enjoys hiking, working on computers, and going places.

As for where she will land after graduation, that is still up for discussion. Aline said she and her boyfriend, who is also in the Cybersecurity and Computer Forensics program, have talked about working in either Brazil or in the US in IT and/or Cybersecurity field.

"My work allows me to troubleshoot and research, and has taught me a lot about the field," she said.

Renowned Art Faculty Foster Creative Environments Where Students Thrive

Each quarter Peninsula College students benefit from the expertise of two talented art professors on the leading edge of their fields.

Known nationally and abroad for their art and ceramic sculptures respectively, professors Michael Paul Miller and Steve Belz will offer courses in introductory, intermediate and advanced painting, life drawing, the history of art, ceramic sculpture and pottery this spring quarter.

Miller, an Associate Professor of Art at Peninsula College, was awarded sabbatical leave in 2016/17, and created "Wild Olympia," a collection of artwork that focuses on Washington's Olympic Peninsula and the wilderness spaces of Olympic National Park.

"My interest in the preservation of external and internal wilderness spaces is portrayed through depictions of iconic places of Olympic National Park, which borrow from the classical Western aesthetic style of art, and are coupled with dynamic negative space drawings," Miller said of his collection.

Prior to his work at PC, Miller held art faculty positions at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, Carroll University, Carthage College, and Herzing College. His paintings have been exhibited in noteworthy galleries and museums across the

United States, and he has received numerous awards, and has been featured in several publications. (www.michaelpaulmiller.com)

Steve Belz says his ceramic sculptures express the beauty of nature and the tension created by our manipulation of the environment.

"Through abstraction, I translate my visions of botanical shapes and landscapes into beautiful organic forms and surfaces to increase the viewer's emotional connection with nature," he said.

Belz has exhibited his work at museums, universities, and galleries all across the country as well as some international exhibitions in Germany, Romania, and Spain.

He has been an artist in residence in at the Künstlerhaus in Neumünster, Germany, the Worcester Center for Crafts in Massachusetts, and Haystack Mountain School of Crafts in Maine. Belz has also given artist talks and conducted workshops at Tennessee Tech, the University of New Hampshire, Künstlerhaus Stadttöpferei in Germany, the University of Montana and Montana State University.

Over the summer, his solo exhibition "Apart" was on display in the RiverSea Gallery in Astoria, Oregon where some of his pieces remain on display. (www.stevebelz.com)

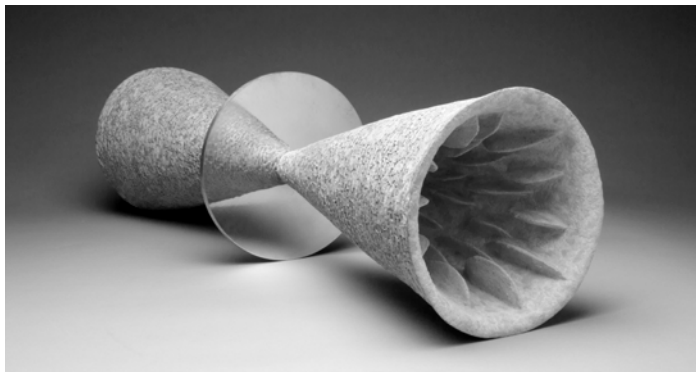

Funding Your Education

To assist you in paying for your education, Peninsula College offers several options for students who qualify. Due to deadlines and limited funds, students are encouraged to apply early. Some programs are designed to support students in specific situations. Eligibility for these programs are usually determined on a funds-available basis and require a separate application to access funds.

FINANCIAL AID | (360) 417-6390

Applying for financial aid is a process that should be started as soon as possible. Work on your Financial Aid file at the same time you are completing other college application requirements.

OPPORTUNITY GRANT | (360) 417-5694

Assists low-income Washington state residents who have not yet earned a degree (Associate or higher). The grant can provide funding for tuition/fees and books/supplies for eligible adults for up to 45 credits in specific programs.

SCHOLARSHIPS | (360) 417-6390

Students who are attending or will be attending Peninsula College can apply now for any number of scholarships.

TUITION PAYMENT PLAN | (360) 417-6232

You can apply to have your tuition and fees divided into three payments.

VETERANS SERVICES | (360) 417-6224

Peninsula College recognizes and appreciates all who have served in the United States Armed Forces. If you are a veteran, or a survivor, or a dependent of a veteran working toward a degree or certificate, you may be eligible for veterans educational benefits.

WORK-STUDY | (360) 417-6359

Offers students the opportunity to gain valuable work experience while earning money for college. Both on-campus and off-campus positions are usually available.

BFET | (360) 417-6296

The Washington state Basic Food Employment and Training (BFET) program provides job search, job search training, educational services, skills training, and other employment opportunities to Basic Food (SNAP) recipients who are not participating in the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) WorkFirst work program.

WORKFIRST PROGRAM | (360) 417-6296

A referral-based program to assist parents receiving Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) that want to further their education. Parents participate in Basic Education for Adults, High School Completion, and Professional-Technical degrees at Peninsula College.

WORKER RETRAINING | (360) 417-6263

This free tuition program provides retraining opportunities for laid off, unemployed, and dislocated workers in the state of Washington. The financial support provided to eligible students does NOT have to be repaid.
