MATH 63 INTRO TO ALGEBRA

Fundamentals of arithmetic using integers, fractions, decimals, exponents, and square roots; solving basic linear equations; solving problems using percents, proportions, and basic geometry. Prerequisite: Placement exam.

MATH 90 ESSNTLS INTERMED ALGEBRA 5

This course develops proficiency with solving linear equations and inequalities, simplifying expressions using the rules of exponents, adding/subtracting/multiplying polynomials, graphing various types of equations and linear inequalities, solving systems of linear equations and inequalities, and finding the equations of lines. Prerequisite: P (2.0 or higher) in Math 063/064 or equivalent.

MATH 98 INTERMEDALGFORCALC 5

This course will expose students to a variety of algebraic techniques that will prepare them for precalculus and calculus. Focus will be placed on quadratic, rational, radical, exponential, and logarithmic expressions and equations.
